GARBAGE & HOW TO DISPOSE:
<u>General Information:</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Garbage is considered anything from your home such as, kitchen waste, toiletry waste, kitchen &amp; bathroom pale stuff.</li> <li>Use watertight containers with covers having a max. capacity of 30 gallons</li> <li>The filled weight of any such container shall not exceed 50 pounds.</li> <li>No more than two 30-gallon containers of garbage will be collected from each household.</li> <li>Place garbage out for collection between 6:00p.m.the night before your scheduled pick-up and 6:00 a.m. the day of your scheduled pick-up.</li> <li>All containers shall be removed from the curb no later than 12 hours after collection.</li> </ul>

BULK TRASH & HOW TO DISPOSE:
<u>General Information:</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Place bulk trash curbside between 6:00 p.m. Tuesday and 6:00 a.m. Wednesday.</li> <li>Place bulk in suitable containers to prevent scattering.</li> <li>50 pound limit to each container.</li> <li>2-cubic yard limit from each household.</li> <li>Large metal appliances are recycled (See Bulk Metal Recycling Schedule).</li> <li>Bulk Trash is considered:                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Furniture, mattresses, clothing, hangers, toys, books, carpeting (3 ft. rolled sections), packing materials, wood fencing, water heater (plastic), old paint (must be dried &amp; lids removed), non-rechargeable batteries.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Not Collected:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Construction &amp; demolition debris: lumber, concrete, dirt, plaster, rock, brick, asphalt, roof material, large wooden crates.</li> <li>Also: Railroad ties, telephone poles, flammable or highly combustible matter such as paint thinner, varnish, oil and gasoline, propane tank.</li> <li>Stones or quantities of sod.</li> <li>Boats/trailers, auto parts, oil tanks, riding mowers, tires &amp; car batteries (take to local repair shop).</li> <li>Corrugated cardboard (see recycling).</li> <li>ELECTRONIC WASTE: See E-Waste or H-MRF boxes on back.</li> </ul>

## RECYCLING PROGRAM

Westchester County law requires recycling of certain materials from the normal household garbage. If your recyclables are co-mingled with your garbage, our sanitation workers cannot pick up your garbage. Please make recycling a priority in your home. Here are some recycling tips:

Review the following procedures and requirements to ready your recyclables for collection.

**DO NOT** mix your plastics, metals & glass with paper and cardboard.

**DO** place your paper and cardboard in a separate bin from the plastics, metals & glass.

**DO NOT** place any recyclables in plastic bags.

**DO** separate your recyclables and place paper/cardboard in a second bin separate from the plastics, metals & glass.

Did you know? All recyclables are **inspected** at the County Recycling Center. Improperly collected material is rejected and a fine may be assessed against the Village.

Need a new **Blue Bin**? Available for purchase at Village Hall.

**BULK TRASH pick up is every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month.**  
**If a Holiday falls on the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday, Bulk is CANCELLED that Wednesday.**

### HELPFUL HINTS

## RECYCLABLE NON-RECYCLABLE

### Plastic



**YES** Milk, water, soda & juice bottles, dish detergent and fabric softener bottles, shampoo and household cleaner bottles, plastic take out containers

**NO** Plastic bags, dishes, vinyl toys, hangers, Styrofoam or cellophane

### Metal

**YES** Food cans, such as soup, fruit, vegetable, & juice cans, pet food cans, beverage & empty aerosol cans, clean aluminum foil, pie plates & trays

**NO** Small appliances or metal furniture, bulk trash metal (such as scrap metal, including pipes, tubing), batteries & paint cans

### Glass

**YES** All UNBROKEN clear, green and brown glass jars & bottles any size, food & beverage containers only

**NO** Ceramics or pottery, light bulbs or window & mirror glass, cookware or ovenware, pesticide or herbicide, drinking glasses or bottles

### Paper and Cardboard

**YES** All newspapers, phone books, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, colored & glossy paper, periodicals, brown paper bags, corrugated cardboard (**must be flattened & loose**), gray/compressed or smooth cardboard, such as cereal, pizza & tissue boxes, towel rollers & paper egg cartons & shredded paper.

**NO** Paperback or hard covered books, wax coated containers



## GREEN WASTE

Place **curbside** between 6:00 p.m. Tuesday and 6:00 a.m. Wednesday (see Schedule for holiday changes). Green waste must be **separated** from other municipally collected solid waste.

**Lawn Debris** shall be placed in biodegradable **paper bags** or placed in **open containers** separate from other yard organics. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

**Dumping** of any type of debris, including lawn clippings and leaves, in any stream, is prohibited.

### BRANCHES & TREES

**Branches** must be less than four (4) inches in diameter and cut into lengths of three (3) feet or less and shall be placed in an open container or tied in bundles.

The Village mulches collected green waste.

**NOT COLLECTED:** Tree trunks, root systems, stumps, logs, debris from an entire tree removal & other large vegetation.

**The Village does not collect loose branches. Removal of trees requires a Permit.**

### FALL LEAVES

Leaves are collected from **October 1 to December 15**. Leaves must be placed in a tight row, a maximum of 4 feet wide, along the center of the curb line. Piles must be **free** of branches, logs, rocks, grass & other yard debris. **DO NOT place leaves in the street or block drains.**

### CHRISTMAS TREES

Collected through **January 15**. Please place trees at the curb any time before January 15. **DO NOT** place trees in plastic bags. Remove all metal wire, lights and nails.

## Get Rid of E-Waste the Right Way

**Facts:** NYS law prohibits "E-Waste" from disposal with household trash.

**These items will no longer be collected curbside.**

**E-Waste:** TVs, computers & all computer components including wires, printers, scanners, fax machines, DVD's, VCR's, digital music players, & video recorders, cable or satellite receivers, electronic or video game consoles, microwaves, and cell phones.

**Reuse:** Try to donate used computer equipment or have your equipment refurbished.

## PAINT CANS & FLUORESCENT BULBS



**Paint cans** can be placed at curbside on Bulk Day. Paint must be dried and lids removed. Inexpensive cat litter or commercial brand paint dryers work great.

**Bulbs** can be recycled at Home Depot in front of the Returns Counter, or at the County Facility (see H-MRF box).

## Protect the Brook

Did you know?

Most portions of the Brooks in the Village are on private property.

Please protect these Brooks by properly disposing of all lawn & yard debris.

## Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF)

A permanent Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) is open at the centrally located facility at 15 Woods Road in Valhalla, NY. The H-MRF will accept household hazardous waste and other items listed below. Residents are able to drop off items throughout the year by appointment only. Go to [www.westchestergov.com](http://www.westchestergov.com) or call (914) 813-5425 to schedule an appointment.

**Mobile Shredder:** The Mobile Shredder is available at the Facility, but be advised that on occasion the Mobile Shredder unit can reach its maximum capacity for paper shredding before closing time.

**Items Accepted:** Properly labeled household chemicals, Polishes & Waxes, Pesticides, Insecticides, Herbicides, Photographic & Swimming Pool Chemicals, Fluorescent Bulbs, Fire Extinguishers & Small Propane Tanks, Cell Phones, Rechargeable Batteries, Mercury Thermometers, all E-Waste (see list in E-Waste box).

**Also Accepted:** Small Appliances, Toasters, Blenders, Radios, Stereos, Speakers, & Lamps, White Waste i.e. Washers, Dryers, Freezers, Stoves, Refrigerators, & A.C.'s, Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Brake Fluid, Gasoline, Vehicle Batteries, Rechargeable Batteries, Tires, Expired or Unused Pharmaceuticals.

**Items Not Accepted:** Paint, Compressed Gas Cylinders, Motor Oil, Smoke & Fire Detectors, Explosives, Medical Waste, Construction Debris, Non-rechargeable Batteries, Plastic Grocery Bags and Materials from Commercial & Institutional Users.

## BULK METAL RECYCLABLES

Place at curb side on **Bulk Metal Day**.

**Appliances:** Stove, washing machine, metal water heater, dishwasher, lawn mower, bicycle (tires removed), swing set (cut to 4 foot sections), bed frame, snow blower, tire rim, fencing.

B-B-Q grills. Note: gas tanks are **NOT** collected.

A/C units, freezers, refrigerators, etc. **Freon** must be removed by licensed Freon Removal Vendor before pickup. Remove doors for safety.

## SHARPS

Place Home Medical Sharps in a durable plastic container like a bleach or detergent bottle, then dispose of container in garbage, or you can drop off Medical Sharps locally at the Port Chester Nursing Home on High St., or any hospital.
